

## CS Energy appoints new facilities management provider

"Programmed FM will deliver a number of the services directly, drawing on a local workforce, while some services will be sub-contracted to companies that specialise in delivering these services.

"Programmed FM's focus will be on employing people and companies with the right skills and capabilities to perform the work and wherever possible, we will seek to contract local people and companies."

The appointment of Programmed FM followed a competitive tender process to secure a contract with a company that had the capability to deliver safe, high quality and cost efficient facility management services at all of CS Energy's sites.

Programmed FM has an excellent safety record and is highly experienced in delivering facilities management services in the energy and resources sectors.
