CS Energy's Swanbank Power Station is helping Prenzlau Rural Fire Brigade volunteers stay in touch during emergencies and improve fire safety.

Swanbank Power Station has donated a hand-held, two-way radio to the brigade for the second year in a row.

Prenzlau Rural Fire Brigade first officer Dave Wandel said the extra radio would improve communication at fire emergencies and assist early warning efforts when fire fighters were in danger.

Swanbank Power Station Site Manager John James said the station was pleased to help Prenzlau Rural Rural Fire Brigade purchase essential equipment.

"The fire service is manned entirely of volunteers and plays an invaluable role in protecting the local community from bushfires," John said.
