## Ipswich community groups share in \$6,000

Four local community groups will share in \$6,000 of funding through the inaugural Swanbank Community Grants Program, Natural Resources and Mines and Energy Minister Stephen Robertson announced today.

Member for Bundamba Jo-Ann Miller welcomed the funding which will support charitable projects in the south west Brisbane and Ipswich area.

"This program makes a big difference to these community groups working to make our region a better place to live.

"Funds will support the groups' work to improve community facilities and services, school amenities and programs and our natural environment," Mrs Miller said.

"Kruger State School P&C, Lions Club of Ipswich, Ripley Valley Rural Fire Brigade and Vision Christian Family will share the \$6,000 in funding allocated for this round of the grants program.

"The successful projects include mobility tables for community education and craft activities, seating, and building extensions."

The Swanbank Community Grants Program is an initiative of CS Energy's Swanbank Power Station.
