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### Mica Creek Power Station achieves major safety milestone

CS Energy's Mica Creek Power Station cemented its reputation as one of the top safety performers in the power generation industry when it achieved four years without a lost time injury this week.

Mica Creek Power Station Site Manager Steve Davison congratulated both staff and contractors for their ongoing commitment to safety.

"Mica Creek currently has the best lost time injury record out of all of CS Energy's power stations," Mr Davison said.

"We've run a busy maintenance program on our gas and steam turbines over the last four years, so to have no lost time injuries during this period is a significant achievement."

Mr Davison said an effective safety induction process for contractors played an important role in achieving Mica Creek's four years injury free status.

"Due to our remote location and the number of overhauls, we often have contractors work at Mica Creek who are not as familiar with the site as our permanent staff," he said.

"I would like to thank Mica Creek staff for building a strong safety culture over the years and passing it on to contractors and visitors to site on a daily basis.

"However we must not be complacent and I encourage the Mica Creek team to maintain their safety focus to take us to five years lost time injury free and beyond."

Mica Creek Power Station is the main provider of electricity in north west Queensland and has a site capacity of 325 megawatts.
