Powerful support helps Laura Johnson Home

CS Energy's Mica Creek Power Station is aiding the valuable work of Mount Isa's Laura Johnson Home by donating office equipment, funds for refurbishment and staff assistance to the facility.

Laura Johnson Home Director of Nursing Lorraine Withington and President of the Board of Directors Alex Dolzan today visited Mica Creek Power Station to thank Site Manager Steve Davison for the donation of a combined photocopier/printer/fax machine.

The station also provided the home with a donation of \$2,000 for painting one of its units and IT assistance from Mica Creek IT Coordinator Keith Griffiths.

Mr Davison said assisting the elderly was one of the power station's community sponsorship priority areas.

"The Laura Johnson Home does a fantastic job providing low and high level aged care in the Mount Isa region," Mr Davison said.

"When we found out their existing photocopier was broken and the expensive repair costs they were facing, we were happy to donate them a new machine."

Ms Withington said the machine would be used every day by staff at the home for tasks such as preparing residents' files, recording bookings and arranging care for residents.

She also thanked Mica Creek for the refurbishment donation and Keith Griffith's IT assistance.

"Keith spent a large amount of his own time fixing an IT issue with our computer network. He installed a new network switch that has made an enormous difference to the performance of our IT system," Ms Withington said.

The Laura Johnson Home has 74 residents and has been in operation since 1973.
